Areas to consider when planning the future for your son/daughter:

Health Care Decisions— <u>Advance Directives</u>;- They provide a way medical decisions may be made without Guardianship.

Financial Planning— <u>Special Needs Trusts</u>—A properly designed Special Needs Trust can protect assists and benefit your family member with a disability while maintaining eligibility for means-tested benefits.

<u>ABLE Accounts</u>—ABLE (Achieving a Better Life Experience) accounts are an innovative way for people with disabilities to save money without Jeopardizing means-tested benefits such as SSI or Medicaid.

Guardianship— <u>Alternatives to Guardianship;</u>—A guardianship is not always necessary. There are alternative ways to address health care decisions and finances that may be preferable to guardianship.

Letter of Intent— A <u>Letter of Intent</u>- is a document that provides a way for you to communicate your desires for your family member to future caregivers. It is a format for you to use to share explicit and important personal information regarding the care of your son or daughter.

Estate Planning— <u>Wills</u>— Estate planning is the process of ensuring that your financial wishes are carried out and that your beneficiaries receive the maximum benefits. Having a Will saves you money, time and heartache. Even if you have a small estate a Will is necessary.
