The Arc of Frederick County is appreciative of the partnerships we have with individuals and families we serve that are built on a mutual trust that allows both the agency and individuals to embrace change together and with confidence.

As The Developmental Disabilities Administration implemented steps towards supporting Maryland with complying with Medicaid's Home and Community-Based Services Settings Final Rule, change was necessary. Fortunately, The Arc's values and visions for delivering services were already in-line with state and federal requirements.

The largest impact to The Arc of Frederick County was the elimination of DDA's Individual Support Services. This change necessitated the realignment of services for more than 225 individuals and families served by The Arc so that they could enroll in Personal Supports Services. The Arc worked to shield people from behind-the-scenes processes so that they could seamlessly receive services without interruption to their daily routines and natural rhythms of their lives. Support Coordinators worked diligently so that service end and start dates matched, that goals were in-line with the new Person Centered Planning process, so that new services available were quickly accessed, and so that people could continue to hire, train, and supervise staff of their choice.

The Arc acknowledges that this journey of change did create a lot more meetings and paperwork for families than they have been used to in the past. The Arc would like to thank people we serve and their families for their cooperative partnerships which allowed The Arc and DDA to meet deadlines so people could have continuity and quality services.

Highlights of the Home and Community Based Final Settings Rule

The Setting Is Integrated In and Supports Full Access To The Greater Community

People served by The Arc of Frederick County live in their own homes. This means that people can choose to live in a family member or caregiver's home, in houses that they own, or in rental properties with their own leases. People choose who they live with. In addition to where they live, people served work in jobs that they obtain to earn a paycheck that sustains a meaningful life in their community. For people who are not currently working, their days include meaningful activities such as volunteering to build employment skills, exercising to maintain a healthy lifestyle, increasing their education and vocational training, and building connections with people in their communities who have shared interests.



Is Selected By The Individual From Among Setting Options



Supports are provided by The Arc of Frederick County so that a person can belong to their chosen communities. The Arc partners with parents and caregivers so that children can access inclusive educational opportunities. This includes collaborating with schools and providing educational advocacy. As children grow, The Arc partners with families to locate inclusive recreational activities such as art classes, sports leagues, and summer camps. As students transition from school to the adult world. The Arc supports people to locate and maintain jobs, provides vocational training in our Culinary Training Program, and assists people to attend college. Adults receive ongoing assistance to connect to their communities. At all points, people served and their family members select the services that make sense for them.



Ensures Individual Rights of Privacy, Dignity and Respect

Historically, many people with developmental disabilities have been denied their right to self-determination and have not had the dignity to make choices and take risks. The Arc of Frederick County embraces the principles of self-determination and opportunities to make choices so that people can be contributing, valued, and respected members of their communities. In addition to individual empowerment, The Arc supports the self-advocacy movement so that people with disabilities can partner with allies to have a strong collective voice that protects existing services and creates new supports.

Optimizes Autonomy and Independence in Making Life Choices

The Arc supports people to have full access to community life. To support people to have truly integrated lives, Support Coordinators from The Arc serve as facilitators to connect people to their communities. Through meaningful planning, people served are provided with information and make both major and day-to-day life choices. The Arc partners with each person served to identify and build networks of support that include paid and unpaid support so that people have the assistance they need to make choices.





Facilitates Choice Regarding Services and Who Provides Them

People served by The Arc partner with Support Coordinators to design lives of their choice. Having the authority over who provides Coaching is a non-negotiable for people served by The Arc. People and their families can refer potential Coaches to The Arc so that we can hire the person to specifically work with them. In addition, people served by The Arc can meet with a screened and trained coaches to interview them and decide if they would like to hire them as a Coach. Coaches provide ongoing, one-to-one support to assist people with living, working, and meaningfully participating in their communities.

We thank all of our members and donors for helping us continue our work to support people with Intellectual and developmental disabilities and their families during FY 2018 (July 1, 2018—June 30, 2019).


